

### The "Good Stuff" in *The Lord of the Flies*

SWBAT identify and explain the following literary devices used in the novel *The Lord of the Flies* by William Golding:

1. Symbolism-noun-the use of symbols to invest things with a representative meaning or to represent something abstract by something concrete
2. Theme-noun-the main idea in a text that conveys something about the human condition or the human experience and is typically a universal concept. It is often implied.
3. Allegory-noun-a work in which the characters and events are to be understood as representing other things and symbolically expressing a deeper, often spiritual, moral, or political meaning
4. Imagery-noun-figurative language used in poetry, plays, and other literary works that produce mental pictures by appealing to the senses.
